To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing this message in regards to what I suspect the foreing material was invoved in Obie's linear foreign body. I suspect that the main portion of the foreign material was wadded up paper towels. There did seem to be some design on them as well. There were also some other small plastic pieces. There were some additional foreign objects that were impossible to identify, but the vast majority 80-90% seemed to be paper towel. As to the question of when he ingested it it is very difficult for me to say. I typically rely on client history to tell me when foreign objects have been ingested. I have seen gastric foriegn bodies that have been present for months. However, in this case I suspect that it was likely within the week as I would expect at some point for gastric acid to have dissolved the paper towel, but maybe not in the quantity.
